### Google Docs & Spreadsheets

#### Tips for Using *REVISE THIS* with Google Docs

- Copy and paste the sentences and email them to the students in a group email through Google Groups ([www.groups.google.com](http://www.groups.google.com)) or any group email.
- Students can then cut and paste the sentences from their email into a Google Docs document and work in pairs to revise the sentences.
- To save class time, student can work at home as a homework assignment since they can collaborate from any computer with an Internet connection.
- Without group email, teachers can print out the sentences and students can simply type each sentence into Google Docs and still collaborate from home.
- Teachers might also want to take awkward sentences from actual student essays and ask students to collaborate to revise them.
